The Institution has not released any further information to date, an announcement is expected in the following days.

### VP External - Brenan Fuiten

RBC on Campus is hosting Job Search 101 on February 23<sup>rd</sup> from 11am-12pm. The event is virtual for students and will provide information about important job search skills. Some Post-Secondary Institution's faculty have gone on strike in the province. A statement released by Mount Royal University states that they have signed an agreement, which is a good sign.

# 12.6.2 Operations Report – Liz Sweiger

The Government of Alberta has removed the Restriction Exemption Program, as well as the capacity restrictions for a venue of the Farside. The Farside has since seen a slight increase in patronage. M. Evangelista, Operations Director, and E. Sweiger have completed 2021 T4s. E. Sweiger is working on the summer operational budget, which will be coming to council in the next few weeks. According to the February 2022 survey 57% of participants want to remain online 43% want to return to in-person learning. E. Sweiger also reminded council of Election nomination period closes March 15<sup>th</sup> and the deadline for Students' Association leadership Scholarships is March 1st.
